In service to God, our mission is to build upon the social, physical, emotional, and spiritual strengths of children, youth, and families, and to affirm their worth.

Hackley Education & Learning Program

Methodist Home for Children (MHC) has always encouraged young people to pursue the education they need for a successful and productive adult life. To support that effort, the agency has a long history of providing financial help for those who have successfully completed its programs and wish to pursue a post-high school education. In 2005, the higher education program was named the **Hackley Education and Learning Program (HELP)** in honor of Dr. Lloyd V. ("Vic") Hackley, in recognition of his commitment to MHC, and his leadership of the MHC Board from July 2002 to June 2005.

Dr. Hackley is a passionate champion for individual growth in character, values, and responsibility. He encouraged MHC to remember the needs of young people 18 years and older entering the period of "transition to permanence." This period is a vulnerable time when most traditional child and family service programs end and access to additional support and guidance is extremely limited.

HELP grants are awarded to qualified MHC applicants to support their post-high school educational goals. The financial awards are generally made directly to colleges, educational institutions or related businesses on behalf of the student. The awards are targeted primarily toward tuition and associated fees related to post high school educational goals. Awards are made based upon demonstrated need and academic performance and are based yearly on availability of funds. The Higher Education Committee reviews applications, reviews progress in academic studies and approves all financial awards. Methodist Home for Children's Higher Education funds are intended to supplement governmental financial awards and any other financial assistance.

Methodist Home for Children has been nurturing children, youth, and families for more than 100 years. Our nonprofit agency serves all children and families regardless of religion, race, or economic status. We provide community-based residential youth homes, foster care, adoption services, substance abuse services, family-based counseling, child care, and child care consultation. MHC is active in communities throughout North Carolina.



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ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for Higher Education funding through MHC, a prospective student must meet the following conditions:

- Have successfully participated in or completed any of MHC's residential programs;
- Have a record of good character and citizenship while in MHC's care and while receiving Higher Education Funds;
- Plan to attend a school, college, university or other educational institution approved by the Higher Education Committee;
- Have a demonstrated need for Higher Education financial assistance;
- Maintain an acceptable scholastic average while receiving funding (equivalent to a "C" average or better (GPA 2.0);
- Remain in frequent contact with his or her assigned committee member, submit copies of current grades or transcripts and other documented scholastic progress.

The number and amounts of Higher Education Funds awarded each year is limited. Should the number of qualified applicants seeking assistance exceed the availability of funds, then the awards will be made on a competitive basis involving committee review of need, scholastic achievement and character.

To enable a student to continue his or her education, grants and scholarships may be awarded to him or her for a period not exceeding one year at a time. Students must resubmit their financial need through their assigned committee member annually. All awards are generally paid directly to the educational institution or related business. The funds are not to be repaid by the student.

To be eligible for an award, a student must meet the conditions of eligibility, submit a written application to the Higher Education committee in adequate time for review and have been accepted into the education institution. All students must first apply for federal, state or local grant, scholarship or financial aid monies. Applications and recommendations are to be made prior to the academic semester for which assistance is applied.

In order to *remain eligible* for continued funding, a student must maintain good character, refrain from any involvement in the criminal justice system, maintain an average of "C" or better, submit grades after each semester or quarter and maintain responsible contact and communication with the assigned committee member.

Should a student drop courses without discussion with his or her assigned committee member, he or she may be required to take an equivalent number of courses at his or her own expense before being eligible for continued funding.
