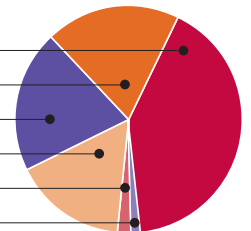

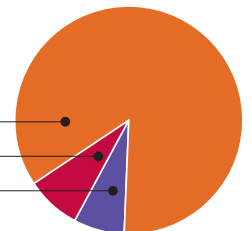
FY 2019–20 BUDGET \$19.5 MILLION
