> > There was one saving grace: Hanna and Dillon had each other. They were never separated in foster care. They were a constant in each other's life.

Now it's time to give them what they deserve – the unconditional love of an adoptive family. A life with a normal rhythm. A life where they can grow up together.

He needs a safety net

In the neighborhood where Ramon grew up, trouble was always just around the corner – or right on his doorstep.
