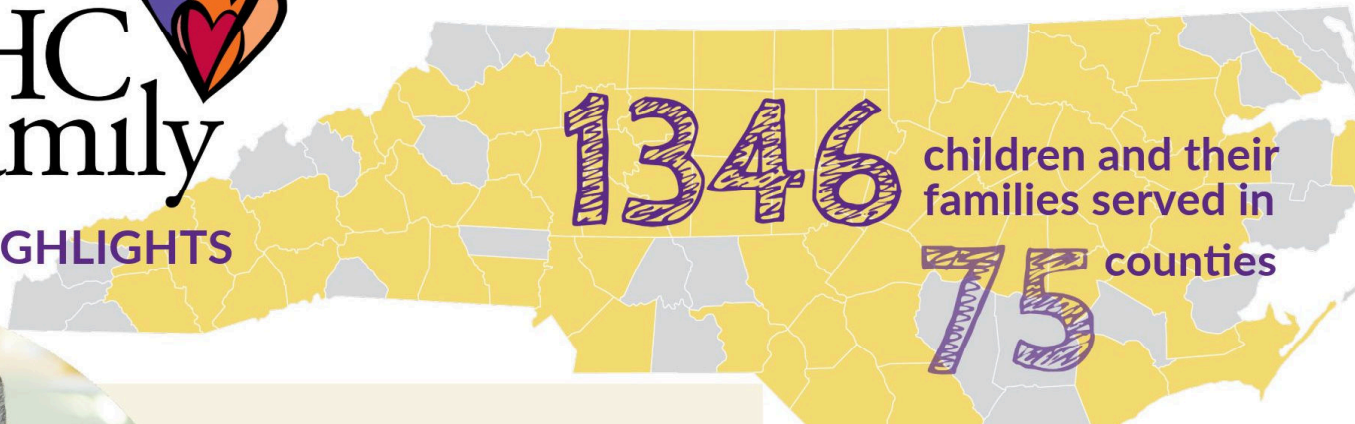

#### foster care

11.2 months, average length of stay

19 age of oldest in care

2 age of youngest in care



#### family preservation

93% of children at risk of being removed from home were able to stay with parents/guardians

#### family reunification

77% of disrupted families were reunified

Opened in October: The Farm, a new transitional living home in Goldsboro

### priming to learn – early childhood services

31% of children at the Jordan and Curtis centers received need-based financial aid

29% received therapeutic support

100% of our preschoolers met kindergarten readiness standards
